Bill Vallicella taught at the University of Dayton (tenured Associate Professor of Philosophy, 1978–1991) and Case Western Reserve University (Visiting Associate Professor of Philosophy; 1989–1991), before retiring to the foothills of the Superstition Mountains, Arizona, from where he now contributes to philosophy mainly through his philosophical blog, *Maverick Philosopher* (February 2009, the blog was selected for the *The Times* of London's 100 Best Blogs List).

Vallicella is author of *Kant, subjectivity and facticity* (Boston College, 1978), *A Paradigm Theory of Existence: Onto-Theology Vindicated* (Kluwer Academic Publishers, 2002), and of more than 60 articles mainly in metaphysics and the philosophy of religion.
